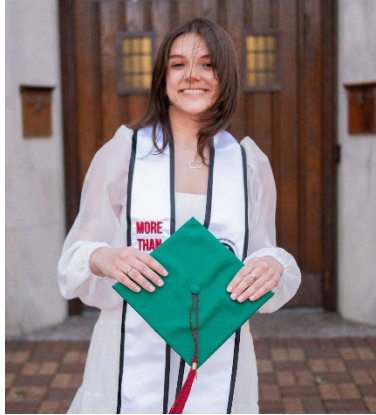

**Professional Project** – Saving the Poweshiek skipperling: bringing a prairie butterfly back from the brink of extinction

The Poweshiek skipperling, a small prairie butterfly, was once widespread in the prairies of the Midwest but has vanished from most of its former range. It is now arguably one of the most endangered species in Michigan, yet the public is hardly aware of its disappearance or why it matters. Its plight is not an isolated case – pollinating insects are declining globally, among them several other prairie butterflies. Now Grand Rapids' John Ball Zoo, in partnership with other Midwest zoos, is raising it in captivity for release into the wild. My professional project will tell the story of the Poweshiek skipperling, the zoos, conservationists and a local township working to save it from extinction and explore the reasons for the decline of pollinators in the Midwest.
